- 2. Cook County, its agents and employees, cannot enforce Order 2021-11 through fines, sanctions, jail, civil or criminal charges, or any other measure against plaintiffs or any other person during the pendency of the case.

If the Court finds the Plaintiffs are likely to succeed against the County Defendants

on their First Amendment claim but are unlikely to succeed on any of their other claims, they request a preliminary injunction ordering that Cook County, its agents and employees, cannot enforce Order 2021-11 through fines, sanctions, jail, civil or criminal charges, or any other measure against plaintiffs or any other person who asserts a sincerely held religious objection to vaccination.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request the Court to enter an Order granting Plaintiffs a preliminary injunction.
